Barmah-Millewa Forest (inc. Gulpa Island)

Yielema North: *Superb Parrot, Grey-crowned Babbler*

Murrays Mill: *robins in winter*

Baxters Pit: *White-backed Swallow, waterbirds*

Barmah Lake: *herons, Welcome Swallow, ibis*

Reed Beds Bird Hide: *Musk Duck, Spotted Crane, Spotless*

Crane, Buff-banded Rail, grebes, Swamp Harrier,

Welcome Swallow, Black Swan, Reed Warbler, Little Grassbird

Duffys Lagoon: *Emu, Red-capped Robin, Flame Robin, Eastern Yellow Robin, Diamond Firetail, herons, Eurasian Coot, Brown Tree-creeper, Rainbow Bee-eater*

Picnic Point: *Nankeen Night-heron, White-browed Scrubwren, Whistling Kite, yellow form of Crimson Rosella*

Gulpa Creek: *Whistling Kite, Black Duck, Brown Tree-creeper, Crested Shrike-tit, Superb Fairy-wren, yellow form of Crimson Rosella, Red-browed Finch, White-plumed Honeyeater, Dollarbird*

Island Sanctuary, Deniliquin: *Superb Parrot, Eastern Great Egret, Darter, Purple Swamp Hen, Little Eagle*

Bendigo Forests (inc. Whipstick & Kamarooka)

Honeyeaters (e.g. White-eared, Tawny-crowned, Fuscous, White-plumed, Yellow-plumed, Purple-gaped, White-fronted), Gilbert Whistler, Golden Whistler, Rufous Whistler, White-winged Chough, Mistletoe Bird

Moama Wetlands: *ibis, herons, Eurasian Coot, Welcome Swallow, Darter, Black Duck, Grey Teal, Black Swan, White-bellied Sea-eagle, Superb Fairy-wren, Zebra Finch*

Five Mile Reserve: *Diamond Firetail, Western Gerygone, Zebra Finch, thornbills, pardalotes, Varied Sittella, Brown Tree-creeper, White-throated Tree-creeper.*

The area covered by this list extends north from Bendigo to Deniliquin and from Tongala north-west to Lake Boga. The area includes Barmah, Boort, Echuca-Moama, Mathoura, Rochester, Bamawn, Mitiamo and surrounding areas. Summer migrants to the area include Dollarbird, Sacred Kingfisher and Rainbow Bee-eater. Winter migrants to the area include Pied Currawong and Flame Robin. Wild Ostriches live midway between Mathoura and Barham. Birds usually only sighted to the north and north-west of the region include Blue Bonnet, Yellow-throated Miner and Australian Ringneck. Birds rarely observed include Australian Bustard, Koel and some migratory waders. The abundance letter (C, M, U & R) relates to this district only. Edition 2.1 July 2013.
